INFORMATION

AGE REQUIREMENTS

Students who have attained the age of eight on or before December 31st and not attained the age of thirteen on or before December 31st will be eligible to compete.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

Dress code requirements for all adults, sponsors, coaches, parents, and judges will be taken from the Student Convention Guidelines. Because this Junior Convention will only be one day, and to help facilitate a smooth transition from one competition to another the following dress code will be required for all the students competing.

FEMALE DRESS (SAMPLE)

Girls may wear skirts, dresses (which are no shorter than the bottom of the knee, standing or sitting), or loose-fitting culottes and tops may be worn for any competition in any area. Slits must be no higher than the bottom of the knee. Dresses and blouses must come to the neckline in front (to the clavicle bone) and back (to the bottom of the neck), without see-through material. TIGHT, FORM-FITTING ATTIRE and fad extremes are inappropriate and will not be allowed. Midriffs must be covered at all times in all positions. Denim, cargo, stone-washed clothing, slacks, shorts, swimsuits, bicycle shorts, V-neck, or sleeveless dresses or blouses will not be allowed. Makeup and jewelry should be conservative and minimal—only one earring (smaller than a dime in size) per ear, in the earlobe. No other body piercings are allowed.

MALE DRESS (SAMPLE)

Male students, sponsors, and coaches must have a neat, trim, conservative haircut. The hair is to be tapered or blocked and is to be off the collar. It is to be above the ears, with sideburns no longer than the middle of the ears. Dying or coloring the tips of the hair is not allowed. No braided or spiked hair styles. For boys with curly hair or afros, the cut needs to be short, not to exceed one inch in length. No facial hair is permitted on contestants. Male competitors in athletic events may wear loose-fitting, full-length sweat pants, warm-up pants, trousers, or **knee length** hemmed shorts. Sleeveless shirts and denim will NOT be allowed. (Exception: A numbered tank top over a T-shirt is acceptable for athletics. T-shirt must match the color of the tank top or be white). Sleeves must stay draped over the shoulders at all times. Uniformity in dress is mandatory for athletic team events. **Knee length** hemmed shorts are allowed for **official athletic competition only**. Shoes must be worn to participate in events. **Full-length sweat pants, warm-up pants, or trousers must be worn over athletic shorts while en route to or from competition.**

EVENTS

Please refer to the Junior Convention Events List. The following restrictions will apply.

- 1. Each student can only enter fifteen total events. (not including open events)
- 2. Each student can only enter four elimination events.
- 3. Each student can enter only 9 performance events.
- 4. Each school may have two teams in boys 3 man basketball
- 5. Each school may have two teams in PACE Bowl
- 6. The minimum time limits listed in the Student Convention Guidelines will be removed for Jr Conv.
- 7. Bible Bowl questions will come from the following books; Luke Colossians, 1 John and Titus.
- 8. Bible Memory questions will be taken from the list of scriptures listed in the Student Convention Guidelines.

OPEN EVENTS

We want to offer as many Open Events as possible. Each open event will be awarded 1st - 3rd. The following events will be offered as Open Events during the day of the convention if the staff necessary to oversee them are available.

MOST CHAPTERS READ

We will be having a competition on Scripture Reading. Starting September 1st and ending October 31st. Students will select a book and then read all the chapters in Bible. The student will continue reading books and adding up the number of chapters as they go along. Each chapter will count as one. We will have two age groups, ages 9-10 & 11-12 we will award 1st - 3rd in both groups. Please fill out the Verification Form (JRCF 11) and turn it in on the day of registration.

SCHEDULE

Registration will be in the morning the day of Convention from 9:00—12:00. Competition will begin at 3:00 pm. Please register as early as possible to help facilitate the scheduling of the events.

LODGING

Lodging and meals are included in the Participant fee. Please bring bedding, towels & personal hygiene items.

MEALS

All meals will be provided in the registration fee for each participant and sponsor. Any adult that would like to eat on campus during the convention will need to buy a meal ticket from Master Control. The evening meal will be held before each evening service.

JUDGING

For the Convention to be the best it can be, we must enlist the help of volunteer judges. To help prepare students for the future we will allow High School students to help judge events at the Junior Convention.
